D.C. GANG DATABASE



In 2009, the DC Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) created a gang database through a Special Order under Chief Lanier. The Special Order came after a harsh *gang civil injunction bill* failed to pass DC Council due to significant community resistance. Today, the database continues to surveil and track over 3,600 residents as young as one-years-old.

DID YOU KNOW?



- DC POLICE ADDED MORE THAN 1,700 PEOPLE TO THE DATABASE IN THE LAST 3 YEARS
- 99.8% OF RESIDENTS ON THE DATABASE ARE BLACK OR HISPANIC
- ABOUT **2900 ADULTS** & **600 MINORS** ARE ON THE DATABASE
- THE DATABASE DISPROPORTIONATELY TRACKS RESIDENTS EAST OF THE RIVER

YOU CAN BE ADDED TO THE DATABASE IF YOU:

- HAVE TATTOOS ASSOCIATED WITH GANGS
- ARE IN PHOTOS MAKING GANG SYMBOLS
- ARE SEEN WITH OTHER PEOPLE LABELED AS GANG MEMBERS
- ARE ARRESTED IN A "GANG AREA"

DATA SHARING

DISMANTLE the gang database and other racist policing tools that target our DC communities

SHIFT resources from policing and criminalization to community building
